Amendments for Fort McMurray Transmission Pipeline Licence 6733 Proceeding 21245 Application 21245-A001

## **Record amendment application**

- 1. ATCO Gas and Pipelines Ltd. (South) (ATCO), by Application 21245-A001 registered on January 8, 2016, filed an application with the Alberta Utilities Commission under Section 12 of the *Pipeline Act* and Section 4.1 of the *Gas Utilities Act* for the following in the Fort McMurray area:
  - addition of unlicenced abandoned pipeline [Line 14 0.22 kilometres (km) of 168.3-millimetre (mm) outside-diameter (OD) pipeline]
  - mapping amendment of lines 3, 7, 12 and 13
  - length amendment of Line 7 from 0.86 km to the revised length of 0.21 km
  - length amendment of Line 12 from 0.04 km to the revised length of 0.22 km
  - 'From Location' and 'To Location' LSD amendment of Line 7
  - status amendment of Line 3 from operating to abandoned
  - 'From' and 'To' facility code amendment of Line 3 from PL to BE
- 2. The proposed amendment is related to facilities previously constructed in accordance with approvals granted in Licence 6733.
- 3. ATCO stated that the original 168.3-mm Fort McMurray transmission pipeline was installed in 1968. Due to slope instability, small segments of the pipeline were relocated in 1970 and 1979. In 2008, a new 168.3-mm pipeline, Line 13, was installed to replace a large segment of the original Fort McMurray transmission pipeline.
- 4. ATCO stated that, upon review of its records, it determined that an application was submitted for a line split, abandonment and installation in 1970; however, the abandoned line does not appear on the licence. ATCO has applied to add Line 14 to reflect the abandonment.

- 5. ATCO also stated that additional licencing errors were discovered during a review of records for lines 3, 7, 12 and 13. In order to correct these errors, ATCO proposed to make the above-listed amendments to Licence 6733.
- 6. ATCO provided information respecting the need, nature and extent of the pipeline record amendment. Since the record amendment does not involve a ground disturbance, there will be no environmental impact.
- 7. Based upon the information provided, ATCO has demonstrated that the proposal is of a minor nature, no other person will be directly affected by the proposal and no adverse environmental impact will be caused by the proposed record amendment.
- 8. The Commission approves the application. The amended licence is attached.
