Amendment to Permit and Licence No. 18438 Application No. 1608073 Proceeding ID No. 1685

Record amendment application

ATCO Gas and Pipelines Ltd. (South) (ATCO), by Application No. 1608073 registered on January 23, 2012, filed an application with the Alberta Utilities Commission (AUC or the Commission) under Section 12 of the *Pipeline Act* and Section 4.1 of the *Gas Utilities Act* for the following changes located in Township 22, Range 29, west of the Fourth Meridian and Township 22, Range 1, west of the Fifth Meridian:

- splitting Line 6 into Lines 6, 15 and 16
- removal of Line 15
- length adjustment to Line 6
- addition of previously constructed pipeline (Line 17 0.14 kilometres of 406.4 millimetre outside-diameter pipeline)
- lines 6 and 16 remain in place

The proposed amendment is related to facilities previously constructed and operating in accordance with approvals granted in Permit and Licence No. 18438.

ATCO stated that in 1998 ATCO (Canadian Western Natural Gas at the time) completed a relocation of a 406.4 millimetre pipeline to accommodate road construction within the city of Calgary. At that time licensing of the relocation was not completed. The work included the installation of 140 metres of new 406.4 millimetre pipeline, under this application Line No. 17 represents this installation, and the removal of 140 metres of the existing pipeline, under this application Line No. 15 represents this removal.

ATCO provided information respecting the need, nature and extent of the pipeline record amendment. Since the record amendment does not involve a ground disturbance, there will be no environmental impact.

Based upon the information provided, ATCO has demonstrated that the proposal is of a minor nature, no other person will be directly affected by the proposal and no adverse environmental impact will be caused by the proposed record amendment.

The Commission approves the application. The amended permit and licence are attached.
