Amendment to Permit and Licence No. 30475

Record amendment application

ATCO Gas and Pipelines Ltd. (South) (ATCO), by Application No. 1608119 registered on February 3, 2012, filed an application with the Alberta Utilities Commission (AUC or the Commission) under Section 12 of the *Pipeline Act* and Section 4.1 of the *Gas Utilities Act* for the following in Townships 53 and 54, Ranges 24 and 25, west of the Fourth Meridian:

- amend the recorded length of Line 13 from 3.28 kilometres (km) to 3.25 km
- amend the recorded length of Line 20 from 0.16 km to 0.19 km
- mapping correction of Lines 42, 43 and 45

The proposed amendment is related to facilities previously constructed and operating in accordance with approvals granted in Permit and Licence No. 30475.

ATCO stated that from 2008-2010 ATCO completed several relocations to allow for the construction of the Northwest portion of the ring road located within Edmonton's Transportation and Utilities Corridor (TUC).

ATCO stated that the pipeline installed at Campbell Road, Line 20, was slightly longer than originally planned to ensure a sufficient depth and length of heavy wall pipe under the proposed roadway. Line 20 required a length correction from 0.16 km to 0.19 km. As a result, Line 13 required a length correction from 3.28 km to 3.25 km. Alberta Transportation has been notified of the change and was provided with an as-built drawing. Also, at 50 Street, Lines 42, 43, and 45 were drawn incorrectly and require a mapping correction.

ATCO also stated that this change and error was discovered while reviewing the as-built drawings in preparation for the submission of Ministerial Consent compliance forms to Alberta Transportation.

ATCO provided information respecting the need, nature and extent of the pipeline record amendment. Since the record amendment does not involve a ground disturbance, there will be no environmental impact.

Based upon the information provided, ATCO has demonstrated that the proposal is of a minor nature, no other person will be directly affected by the proposal and no adverse environmental impact will be caused by the proposed record amendment.

The Commission approves the application. The amended permit and licence is attached.
