1 INTRODUCTION

- 1. ATCO Gas and Pipelines Ltd. (South) (the Applicant) filed an application with the Alberta Utilities Commission (the Commission) seeking approval for an amendment to Permit/Licence 15440 for the following: (the Project)
 - MOP decrease for Lines 4, 6, 8, 9, 10, 12, 14, 16, 18, 20, 22, 23, 27, 29 and 30.
 - Grade correction for Lines 14 and 29.
 - Facility code correction for Lines 2 and 4.

2 BACKGROUND

- 2. The application was registered on October 27, 2009, as Application 1605576 (the Application).
- 3. The Applicant stated that the amendment was necessary to decrease the MOP of a section of the Golden Spike Line to meet class 3 requirements (due to increasing development in the area) and to make record corrections.

3 DISCUSSION

- 4. The Commission has reviewed the Application and has determined that it meets the requirements as stipulated in AUC Rule 020. The Commission notes that a participant involvement program has been conducted by the Applicant and that there are no outstanding public or industry objections or concerns.
- 5. Since no parties objected to the Application and the Project is necessary to meet class 3 requirements (due to increasing development in the area) and to make record corrections, the Commission considers the Project to be in the public interest.

4 DECISION

6. Therefore, pursuant to section 11 of the *Pipeline Act*, section 4.1 of the *Gas Utilities Act*, the Commission approves the amendment to Permit/Licence 15440 for the Project and grants the Applicant the amended Permit/Licence as set out in Appendix 1 – Gas Utility Pipeline - MOP Decrease and Record Corrections– Permit/Licence No. 15440 – November 2, 2009 (Appendix 1 will be distributed separately).
