1 INTRODUCTION

- 1. AltaGas Utilities Inc. (the Applicant) filed an application with the Alberta Utilities Commission (the Commission) seeking approval for an amendment to Permit/Licence 203 for the following: (the Project)
 - Abandonment of Line 54.

2 BACKGROUND

- 2. The application was registered on October 29, 2009 as Application 1605578 (the Application).
- 3. The Applicant stated that the amendment was necessary due to the construction of the Aspen Water Treatment Plant resulting in a portion of the existing pipeline to have less depth of cover than the required CSA Standard Z662-03.
- 4. According to the Applicant, Line 54 was abandoned in place. The pipeline was purged with nitrogen and capped at both ends.

3 DISCUSSION

- 5. The Commission has reviewed the Application and has determined that it meets the requirements as stipulated in AUC Rule 020. The Commission notes that a participant involvement program has been conducted by the Applicant and that there are no outstanding public or industry objections or concerns.
- 6. Since no parties objected to the Application and the Project is necessary due to a portion of the existing pipeline having less cover than the required in CSA Standard Z662-03, the Commission considers the Project to be in the public interest.

4 DECISION

7. Therefore, pursuant to section 11 of the *Pipeline Act* and section 4.1 of the *Gas Utilities Act*, the Commission approves the amendment to Permit/Licence 203 for the Project and grants the Applicant the amended Permit/Licence as set out in Appendix 1 – Pipeline Abandonment – Permit/Licence No. 203 – November 4, 2009 (Appendix 1 will be distributed separately).
