**Pipeline in the Carseland Area**  
**Licence 10844**  
**Proceeding 22439**  
**Application 22439-A001**

**Record amendment application**

1. ATCO Gas and Pipelines Ltd. (South) (ATCO), by Application 22439-A001, registered on February 23, 2017, filed an application with the Alberta Utilities Commission under Section 12 of the *Pipeline Act* and Section 4.1 of the *Gas Utilities Act* for the following:
  - splitting line 4 into lines 4 and 11
  - “From” facility code amendment of line 4 from pipeline, PL, to regulating station, RS
  - “To Location” range amendment of original line 4 from Range 25 to Range 26
  - length amendment of original line 4 from 6.20 kilometres to 6.06 kilometres
  - pipe specification amendment of line 11 from aluminum to steel
2. The proposed amendment is related to facilities previously constructed and operating in accordance with approvals granted in Licence 10844.
3. ATCO stated that the Carseland Transmission Pipeline and associated distribution pipelines in the town of Carseland were installed in 1976/1977 under a joint distribution Licence G430 and transmission Licence 14591. In 2002, the high pressure pipelines under Licence G430/14591 were transferred to Licence 10844. During the transfer process the pipeline crossing Range Road 260 was removed from the licence and aspects of line 4 were adjusted to account for the transfer. ATCO is requesting approval to add the pipeline road crossing back onto Licence 10844, which requires a length amendment, “To Location” range amendment, and line split. The “From Location” facility code was also found to be incorrect on line 4 and the correct facility code has been used in this application.
4. ATCO provided information respecting the need, nature and extent of the pipeline record amendment. Since the record amendment does not involve a ground disturbance, there will be no environmental impact.

5. Based upon the information provided, ATCO has demonstrated that the proposal is of a minor nature, no other person will be directly affected by the proposal and no adverse environmental impact will be caused by the proposed record amendment.
6. The Commission approves the application. The amended licence is attached.
