## **Record amendment application**

ATCO Gas and Pipelines Ltd. (South) (ATCO), by Application No. 1610351, registered on February 26, 2014, filed an application with the Alberta Utilities Commission (AUC or the Commission) under Section 12 of the *Pipeline Act* and Section 4.1 of the *Gas Utilities Act* to delete Line 186 from Permit and Licence No. 2913, in Township 48, Range 10 west of the Fourth Meridian, in order to effect the transfer of Line 186 from ATCO to ConocoPhillips Canada (ConocoPhillips). The proposed amendment is related to facilities previously constructed and operating in accordance with approvals granted in Permit and Licence No. 2913.

ATCO stated that upon review of its records it was determined that Line 186 of Permit and Licence No. 2913 was missed on the original transfer to Burlington Resources in 2002. It was also determined that ConocoPhillips is the successor to Burlington Resources and is now operating and maintaining this pipeline and as such ConocoPhillips is in agreement with the proposed transfer. ATCO would like to correct this licence issue by transferring the above mentioned line to ConocoPhillips, to reflect the correct pipeline ownership. Upon approval of the transfer from the AUC, ATCO would proceed with the transfer of the pipeline within the Alberta Energy Regulator DDS system to complete the transaction. ConocoPhillips would receive a new licence and line number for Line 186 of Permit and Licence No. 2913. Upon the acceptance from the Alberta Energy Regulator, ATCO would then notify the AUC.

ATCO provided information respecting the need, nature and extent of the pipeline record amendment. Since the record amendment does not involve a ground disturbance, there will be no environmental impact.

Based upon the information provided, ATCO has demonstrated that the proposal is of a minor nature, no other person will be directly affected by the proposal and no adverse environmental impact will be caused by the proposed record amendment.

The Commission approves the application. The amended permit and licence will be issued upon approval of the pipeline transfer by the Alberta Energy Regulator.
