## Foothills Pipe Lines Ltd. (Foothills) Short Term Firm Transportation (STFT) Service Application

On 3 December 2004, Foothills filed an STFT service application with the National Energy Board pursuant to Part IV of the *National Energy Board Act* for an order or orders approving an STFT service on Foothills' Zone 9 and associated amendments to the Foothills' Gas Transportation Tariff – Phase 1 to be effective 1 January 2005. Foothills also filed an amendment to this application on 7 December 2004. The Board has completed its examination of Foothills STFT service application, as amended, and comments received from Tenaska Marketing Canada dated 8 December 2004, BP Canada Energy Company, the Canadian Association of Petroleum Producers, Cargill Power & Gas Markets, EnCana Corporation, Nexen Marketing, and Oxy Energy Canada, LLC (OEC) dated 9 December 2004. The Board notes that all parties who filed comments recommended that the Board approve the implementation of Foothills' proposed STFT service effective 1 January 2005.

The Board approves the proposed STFT service on Foothills' Zone 9 and associated amendments to the Foothills' Gas Transportation Tariff – Phase 1 to be effective 1 January 2005. Foothills is directed to serve forthwith a copy of this letter and attached Order TG-10-2004 on all of its interested parties (TG-6-81), and its firm and interruptible shippers.

OEC requested that the Board order Foothills to allow any party that requested a short term transportation service prior to 31 October 2004 and then was forced to contract for a one year term effective 1 November 2004 to protect their markets, be given the option to terminate that transportation contract and recontract for Foothills' new STFT service commencing 1 January 2005.

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In the Board's view, there is no evidence to suggest that Foothills did not act in a prudent and expeditious manner in establishing an STFT service after it had received requests from shippers. Therefore, the Board denies OEC's request.

## ORDER TG-10-2004

**IN THE MATTER OF** the *National Energy Board Act* and the Regulations made thereunder, and the *Northern Pipeline Act*; and

**IN THE MATTER OF** an application by Foothills Pipe Lines Ltd. (Foothills) dated 3 December 2004, and as amended on 7 December 2004, pursuant to Part IV of the *National Energy Board Act* for approval of a short term firm transportation service and associated amendments to its Gas Transportation Tariff – Phase I (STFT Application).

**BEFORE** the Board on 23 December 2004.

**WHEREAS** Foothills filed its STFT Application on 3 December 2004 as well as an amendment to this application on 7 December 2004.

**AND WHEREAS** comments recommending approval of the STFT Application were received from Tenaska Marketing Canada dated 8 December 2004, and from BP Canada Energy Company, the Canadian Association of Petroleum Producers, Cargill Power & Gas Markets, EnCana Corporation, Nexen Marketing, and Oxy Energy Canada, LLC dated 9 December 2004;

**AND WHEREAS** the Board has considered Foothills' STFT Application, as amended, as well as comments received;

**THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED**, pursuant to Part IV of the NEB Act, that:

Foothills' proposed STFT service on Zone 9 and associated amendments to the Foothills' Gas Transportation Tariff – Phase 1 are approved and are to be effective 1 January 2005.
