



received by that date, the Tribunal Registry attempted to contact Chief Bone by telephone on July 27 and again on July 29, 2009, but the Tribunal's telephone messages were not returned.

[9] Neither the complainant or the respondent satisfied their disclosure obligations pursuant to Rule 6(1) of the Tribunal's Rules and Procedures.

[10] No evidence was called or otherwise provided in support of Joan Jollasse's complaint at the hearing on September 21, 2009.

[11] Accordingly, I find that the complaint against the Keeseekoowenin First Nation has not been substantiated and it is hereby dismissed under section 53(1) of the *Canadian Human Rights Act*.
