WHEREAS the Canada Industrial Relations Board (the Board) has received an application for certification pursuant to section 24(1) of the *Canada Labour Code* (the *Code*) from the applicant seeking certification as bargaining agent for a unit of employees of the Canadian Corps of Commissionaires (Southern Alberta) comprising:

All employees of the Canadian Corps of Commissionaires (Southern Alberta) working at the Calgary International Airport, excluding Security Supervisors, those above the rank of Supervisor, and office and clerical staff

AND WHEREAS the parties reached an agreement on a modified bargaining unit description comprising:

All employees of the Canadian Corps of Commissionaires (Southern Alberta) working at the Calgary International Airport, excluding supervisors, those above the rank of supervisor, and office and clerical staff

AND WHEREAS, following investigation of the application and consideration of the submissions of the parties concerned, the Board has found the applicant to be a trade union within the meaning of the *Code*, has determined the unit described hereunder to be appropriate for collective bargaining and is satisfied that a majority of the employees of the employer in the unit wish to have the applicant trade union represent them as their bargaining agent.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is ordered by the Canada Industrial Relations Board that the Logistics, Manufacturing and Allied Trades Union, CLAC Local 56 be, and it is hereby certified to be, the bargaining agent for a unit comprising:

all employees of the Canadian Corps of Commissionaires (Southern Alberta) working at the Calgary International Airport, **excluding** supervisors, those above the rank of supervisor, and office and clerical staff.
