**CT-2024-010 – Commissioner of Competition v. Google Canada Corporation and Google LLC – Request for Extension of Time to File Response and First Case Conference**

We are counsel to the Respondents, Google Canada Corporation and Google LLC (together, “**Google**”), in the above-noted proceeding. We ask that a copy of this letter and attached Motion Record be provided to the judicial member of the panel presiding over the above-noted proceeding.

With the consent of the Commissioner of Competition (“**Commissioner**”), Google respectfully requests an extension of time pursuant to rule 5 of the *Competition Tribunal Rules* for the service and filing of its Response to the Notice of Application of the Commissioner to February 14, 2025.
