14-7014. Life imprisonment without possibility of parole proceeding; aggravating circumstances; murder of a peace officer; essential elements.

Before you may find the aggravating circumstance of murder of a peace officer, you must find that the state has proved to your satisfaction beyond a reasonable doubt that at the time (name of victim) was murdered, (name of victim):	
1.	was a peace officer;
2.	was performing the duties of a peace officer;
(name	the defendant knew or should have known thate of victim) was a peace officer; [A peace officer is a public employee whose syment duties include maintaining the public order;] ² and
	the defendant intended to kill or acted with a reckless disregard for human life new that [his] [her] acts carried a grave risk of death.

USE NOTES

- 1. This instruction is to be used only in a life imprisonment without possibility of release or parole proceeding.
- 2. If there is an issue as to whether or not the victim was a "peace officer" the bracketed definition is given.
