USE NOTES

- 1. This instruction should be given immediately after the instructions containing the elements of the offenses charged in the count.

The instruction is drafted to accommodate three levels of the offense: "greatest," "next lower," and "lowest," but can be modified to account for any number of lesser-included offenses following the same procedure. The offenses should be identified by the names used in the elements instruction for that offense.
 - 3. If there is more than one count, identify the count charged.
