**Summary:** 

Shareholders in company had a falling out. They had multiple meetings to discuss the purchase of the plaintiff's shares. The parties reached a verbal agreement, but the transaction was not completed. Plaintiff sued for enforcement of the agreement. As an alternative, plaintiff alleged oppressive conduct by failure to provide accurate financial information and consult on business decisions. Plaintiff was president and director of the company

**Issue:** 

- (1) Did the parties reach a verbal agreement and, if so, is it enforceable?
- (2) Did the defendants engage in oppressive conduct and, if so, what remedy should be given?

**Result:** 

The parties agreed on the essential terms for the purchase of the plaintiff's shares, but this was subject to preparation of a written agreement. The written agreement was never concluded, and so no legally enforceable contract came into existence.

The plaintiff's complaints about lack of financial information and consultation did not amount to oppression. As president, he was entitled to have the information, but took no steps to obtain it.

Application was dismissed.
