1 THE COURT: Albert Wanderingspirit has entered
2 a plea of guilty to a charge of mischief. This was a
3 reduced plea with the consent of the Crown. The facts
4 support that plea. Mr. Wanderingspirit was originally
5 charged with the offence of break and enter of a
6 dwelling house with intent to commit an indictable

The facts are very straightforward. The accused in the company of another man went to the home of this other man's sister-in-law. She wouldn't let them in, no doubt partly because of the accused's level of intoxication. Nevertheless he tried to get in by prying open the door, causing damage to the door, and he eventually managed to get into the house through a window. He left when he was confronted and arrested shortly thereafter; apparently he was intoxicated at the time. Fortunately no further harm was done by this accused.

He has a lengthy criminal record dating back to 1962. Most of them appear to be relatively minor offences but it is obvious that Mr. Wanderingspirit has a significant amount of problems in controlling his behavior. He is a mature man who by this point in his life should be able to control himself and come to grips with whatever difficulties he does have when he drinks.

submission saying that an appropriate sentence would be 1 one of four months incarceration. It is certainly one 2 that is within the acceptable parameters for this type of an offence, having regard to this type of an 5 offender. 6 Mr. Wanderingspirit, now if you would stand up. 7 Do you have anything that you wish to say? THE ACCUSED: 8 Yeah, well I got a job fishing out in the lake. I probably got another month to go until 9 the boat gets out. I guess that's all I wanted to 10 11 The guy I was fishing for was supposed to go on 12 the weekends too he goes Sundays; Saturdays and Sundays 13 too. 14 THE COURT: Well, that is good, and I guess the major thing that you have to do is come to grips 15 with the problems that alcohol causes you, try to deal 16 17 with that. You are old enough I am not going to put 18 you on probation or set out some terms or conditions 19 for you to comply with. You are old enough that you should be able to control your own behavior and know 20 what you have to do. 21 It is the sentence of this Court that you serve 22 a term of imprisonment of four months. 23 In addition 24 there will be a \$25 victim of crime fine surcharge, 25 that is to be paid within 30 days of his release. 26 Is there anything else, counsel? 27 MR. COUPER: No, My Lord.
