

of the Peace in terms of the wording that she used, but I tend to agree with Mr. Tarrabain. My interpretation of what she says leads me to conclude that because it is a serious charge and because there was a lot of drug involved and because of the value, she felt constrained to refuse his release under the tertiary ground. That, as I read it, is a reversible error. It is, in effect, as some of the cases mentioned by Mr. Tarrabain have suggested, putting the cart before the horse. In other words, punishment before guilt is established.

I can't second-guess the Justice

The Crown here has probably a strong case, but it is not so strong as to be totally immune from successful attack during the course of a trial.

Having found error and having considered the background of the accused and the circumstances surrounding the commission of the alleged offence, it seems to me that this is a proper case for granting of release and that a right-thinking person of the community would not be offended.

The conditions will have to be stringent, and here I'm in counsels' hands in terms of what is suggested by way of terms. The usual of course: keep the peace and be of good behaviour, report to the Court when required.
