Transcript of the Oral Reasons for Sentence by The Honourable Justice V.A. Schuler, at Yellowknife in the Northwest Territories, on October 25th A.D., 2001.

THE COURT: The facts have been read into the record, and I am not going to go through them in any detail. As I just indicated, and Crown counsel confirmed, it appears that on the date in question, the civilian agent was interested in this Mr. King and was interested in investigating him with respect to drug activity, that Mr. Patry, who knew the agent and obviously knew Mr. King, happened to be at the scene where the agent went to meet with Mr. King and then when Mr. King left to go boating, the agent took some calls on Mr. King's cell phone, calls from people looking for drugs, and that Mr. Patry then became involved with some encouragement from the agent and, in effect, made a deal for sale of some drugs by Mr. King to one of the individuals who called.

I think the way that the Crown has characterized the facts, and the defence too, obviously there was some encouragement by the civilian agent.

I have to say it never fails to amaze me how people can, and in my view so naively, simply fall for an approach by someone who says they want to buy drugs or will you help me sell drugs or whatever it may be. Maybe I am just becoming cynical but I am amazed that people trust anyone who comes to them wanting them to become involved in drugs and it

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your lifestyle isn't going to be any different. is going to be sitting in the penitentiary. That's what it is going to be and you should realize that now before you go any further. It seems to me that at the age of 25, and obviously you have enough ambition and enough wherewithal to go to college, giving up all that or endangering all of that by trafficking in drugs is going to mean that the only college that you are going to go to is whatever they can give you in the penitentiary. You are an adult, it is your decision, you have to do your own thinking and make your decision, but it just seems to me that this situation, it was very foolish of you to get involved in this and you better do an awful lot of thinking about what you want to do with your life.

I have considered that both counsel are submitting that at this point I simply sentence you to time served. I have to say that with your criminal record, if it wasn't for the specific facts that are before me, I think that you could be looking at something quite a bit longer than that but in light of the facts and the submissions made -- stand up, please --

Mr. Patry, I am going to sentence you to time served and I do that using the principle that remand time is often accredited as being twice the face
