Bouvier, with some reluctance, I am going to go along with what these lawyers are suggesting by way of a sentence for this assault that you committed on this older man, Mr. Tanche.

You have been to Court many, many times, Mr. Bouvier. So I want you to listen to me carefully when I say to you that you are very lucky that the Crown is only asking for 12 months' jail. I don't believe you have appeared in front of me before, but I can assure you, and you think about this in the next while, that the sentence could be a lot, lot higher. So you count your blessings when you go back to jail today.

You have a terrible record. You obviously have a liquor problem, a booze problem, that you have got to come to grips with or you are going to spend the rest of your life in jail. So you think about that when you are finishing your sentence and you go back to Fort Providence. You have got to stay away from the booze, because it is just predictable that you are going to commit a crime of violence and be back in court, and I doubt very much that you are going to find the lawyers saying, "Don't send him to jail for any more than 12 months."

You are 33 years old. You should be mature. You should understand these things. But you also are still young. You have got a lot of life ahead of you.
