of Fort Good Hope. I think it's around 5 or 600. I notice, Mr. Kakfwi, we have over 100 charges dealing with kids on the docket and over 120 or 30 charges with adults. It seems to me this community needs some leadership, someone like you with an education, with experience, with a good background are in a position to provide that leadership.

The conduct that the Crown Attorney has described to me is the antithesis of leadership. It's the absolute There have been people killed in the Northwest Territories -- there was a little girl in Tuktoyaktuk that was run over by a guy on a snowmobile and killed. There was a woman run over by a snowmobile in Pond Inlet and had her legs broken. There were one or two boys killed in Snowdrift who were fooling around, racing around with snowmobiles in a crowd. At your age, with your education, I have difficulty accepting that you panicked when you saw the police. You knew you weren't supposed to be driving. Putting the kids in this community in danger like that is just unacceptable. Stand up please, Mr. Kakfwi. I'm taking into account that you've pleaded guilty. I take that into mitigation and it has substantial weight. In my view, a short term of imprisonment is necessary. I can't see, notwithstanding your position and your current situation, any reason for treating you any differently than anyone I'm taking into account, as I said, that you pleaded else. guilty and that is reducing what I would think would



otherwise be appropriate. I'm taking into account what 1 your lawyer has said on your behalf. I trust that following 2 this experience, you will recognize your responsibilities when it comes to driving. With respect to the charge of driving while disqualified, you're to be sentenced to a term of imprisonment of one month. With respect to the charge of dangerous driving, one month and 15 days consecutive. On the charge of dangerous driving, you will be prohibited from driving a motor vehicle for one year pursuant to the 10 Criminal Code. That will be one year from today's date. 11 MR.
