

THE COURT: Steven Iyago comes before the Court admitting that he assaulted his father because of an argument that he was having with his sister. He punched his father in the nose and gave him a black eye and swollen cheek. At the time of the offence he was under the influence of alcohol, and when examined indicated that he intended to apologize to his father. Through counsel he has indicated today that he feels embarrassed and sorry for having committed the assault on his father. He comes before the Court, however, with two previous assaults in 1985 in October when he was fined One hundred and fifty dollars on one and Three hundred and fifty dollars on the other, and there are a number of offences that appear to relate to problems with alcohol. He is now indicating that he intends to stop drinking, because I presume he is finally realizing that it

Crown and Defence have both suggested that a fine might be appropriate, because he has employment in maintenance and supervisory work with the hamlet. He has a good education and has a common-law wife with a six year old child. I am satisfied that a fine is in this instance appropriate, but must suggest to Mr. Iyago that if he were to appear before the Court with any assault in the future, even a minor assault, it is likely that the Court would then have to consider a period of time in jail.

is having some substantial effect on his life.

The fine in this instance will be in the amount of One thousand dollars, or in default thereof three months in jail. The accused will be placed on probation for a period of

one year. One of the terms will be that he will participate in alcohol counselling or treatment programs recommended by the probation officer. In addition thereto, Mr. Iyago will refrain absolutely from the possession or consumption of alcohol for a period of four months. How much can Mr. Iyago pay each month on that fine? MR. IYAGO: Two hundred. THE COURT: You can pay each month Two hundred dollars? MR. IYAGO: Okay. THE COURT: You will be sure to pay that if we allow you five months to pay it? 11 MR. IYAGO: Yeah. THE COURT: All right. The accused will be allowed five 13 months to pay on the understanding that he is to pay at least 14 Two hundred dollars a month. The Clerk will be preparing the 15 probation order, Mr. Iyago, and you will be required to sign it. 16 You understand now that it is a criminal offence 17 if you for the next four months have possession of and consump 18 tion of alcohol in any way, do you? 19 MR. IYAGO: M':hmm. 20 MR. BRUSER: Your Honour, sometimes when an order is made of 21 22 no alcohol the Courts do make a further order that he, the person, submit to a breathalyzer analysis if the Police Officer feels 23 he has been drinking. 24 THE COURT: Is there a breathalyzer machine in this community? 25
