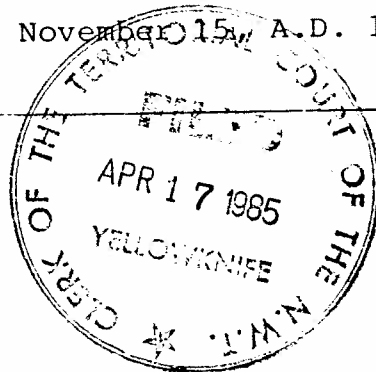

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Transcript of the oral sentencing delivered by His Honour Judge T.B. Davis, sitting at Fort Norman, in the Northwest Territories, Thursday, November 15<sup>th</sup>, A.D. 1984.

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THE COURT: Mr. James Wrigley who is a local maintenance fore-  
man and a resident of Fort Norman in the Northwest Territories  
has entered pleas of guilty to two charges, admitting that  
he assaulted Wilbert Wright, contrary to Section 245, and  
caused a disturbance, contrary to Section 171 when he was  
drunk at the Halloween dance in this community on November  
the 3rd, 1984. He became obnoxious at the dance and had to  
be removed and arrested and at the time had spent three days  
in jail until released on a Show Cause Hearing. So, he has  
already had some penalty imposed as a result of his actions  
on that evening. I understand, as well, that the accused  
is usually a responsible person and has apologized for his  
actions. But because he comes before the Court with previous  
offences over the last few years, having in 1980 and '83 been  
involved with assault charges and in 1984 resisting arrest,  
I am going to impose fines as the penalty on sentencing for  
the accused today with the hope that he realizes that by not  
going to jail and not being placed on probation the Court is  
accepting his undertaking to act in a proper manner and not  
be drunk and cause disturbances in public places in the  
future.

On the charge of assault, I am going to impose a  
fine in the amount of \$200.00, or in default thereof ten days  
in jail. On causing the disturbance, I am going to impose a  
fine in the amount of \$100.00, or in default thereof five  
days in jail.

MR. VERTES: Can the accused have two months to pay, Your Honour?


1 THE COURT: The accused will be allowed two months. Mr. Wrigley,  
2 you can make payments of part of that amount each month, if  
3 it is more convenient, and we would ask you to do that, in  
4 actual fact, pay \$150.00 one month and the balance the other.

5 MR. SHARKEY: There is no evidence on the remaining counts on  
6 each information.

7 THE COURT: The other charges against you are being dismissed,  
8 Mr. Wrigley.
