Well, I have heard your submissions and have a pre-sentence report, of course. Mr. Lockhart has been on probation before not to drink, and he is not a good subject for probation. I have to send you to jail for some period of time to try to get through to you, Mr. Lockhart, that you can't be doing things like this.

I guess I don't take the matter of bringing beer into Snowdrift and using the suitcase to transport it very heavily. In any event, there were seven charges before me, and I convict you on them all except that I don't convict on the 306(1)(b). I do convict on 306(1)(a). I think obviously I must look at the totality of the term of incarcera-It may be it doesn't matter too much how I allocate it between the seven offences.

Stand up, Mr. Lockhart. On my Information number 1624 I convict you of the offence of 306(1)(a), break and enter with intent. I direct you be imprisoned for a period of two months. On my Information number 1675, the breach of probation arising from that, I direct you be imprisoned for a period of one month to be served concurrently. On my Information number 1628, the stolen goods, the suitcase, I direct you be imprisoned for a period of one month to be served consecutively. On my Information number 1626, the breach of probation arising from that, I direct you be imprisoned for a period of one month to be served concurrently. On my Information number 1627, the liquor prohibition matter, I convict you and direct you be imprisoned for a period of

one month to be served concurrently. On my Information 1236, the assault on Tommy Lockhart causing bodily harm, I direct you be imprisoned for a period of three months to be served consecutive. On my Information number 1237, the breach of probation arising from that, I direct you be imprisoned for a period of one month to be served concurrently.

So, if you check me, I have two months on the B & E, one month on the 312 consecutive, and three months on the assault causing consecutive, a total of six months consecutive time, and there are four concurrent sentences.

Jerry, I have seen you before, you're a bright young fellow, and whether you can operate in Snowdrift or operate in Edmonton, I don't know, but you have got to clean up your act. The more you come to Court, the longer you are going to go to jail. It's all up to you. If you have a liquor problem, the people at the jail will try to help you, but it's up to you.

MR. GOWER: Your Honour, if I might just clarify.

THE COURT: Yes.

MR. GOWER: You referred to a breach of probation arising out of the Section 312 offence. I don't have an Information on that.

THE COURT: It may be my notes were wrong. It was my

Information number 1626 re the 26th of May, to refrain from

possession or consumption of alcohol.

MR. GOWER: Yes, that was the breach arising from the liquor prohibition violation.
