THE COURT: Well, this twenty year old man was driving on the 15th of August near Detah with a female passenger in the He went off the road. His passenger was cut about the face, but happily she was not severely injured. When he took the breathalyzer test he blew point-twenty-two on both blows, which are very high. It's a serious matter because the passenger was injured and could have easily been injured much more seriously. He was arrested and placed in cells and released at six o'clock in the evening on that day. The next day, the 16th of August, another motorist in Yellowknife complained about his driving at shortly after ten o'clock in the evening. The Police arrested him again, and he blew on this occasion pointtwenty-nine and point-thirty-one, which are the highest blows I've seen for a couple of years.

This is a very serious occurrence being it was just the day after the first one, together with the interfering with another motorist and the high amount of alcohol in his system. It was obviously a danger to anybody on the streets. I would be inclined to give him some time in jail for these occurrences, but he has a good job, and I don't want him to lose that job.

Would you stand up, please, Mr. Tobie. I convict you on the charge of driving while drinking on the 15th of August. I direct you pay a fine of One thousand dollars, in default of payment one month imprisonment. I convict you on the charge of driving while drinking on the 16th of

August. I direct you pay a fine of Fifteen hundred dollars, in default of payment six weeks consecutive. You only had a beginner's license or a learner's permit, as we call it.

You certainly got your driving career off to a dandy start.

I convict you on that charge under the Vehicle's Ordinance.

I direct you pay a fine of Fifty dollars.

What will happen to the failure to appear charge, Mr. Sharkey?

MR. SHARKEY: We'll call no evidence on it.

THE COURT: There's no plea. So, it will be withdrawn.

MR. SHARKEY: Yes.

THE COURT: Now, it's a total of Twenty-five hundred and fifty dollars. I'll give you four months. Will that suffice?

MR. FOLDATS: Your Honour, perhaps six months would be --

THE COURT: Very well. Six months to pay the fines. I also order you be prohibited from driving for a period of two years.

MR. FOLDATS: Thank you, Your Honour.

THE COURT: Thank you, Mr. Foldats.
