Transcript of the Oral Sentencing Delivered by His Honour Judge

T. B. Davis, sitting in Yellowknife in the Northwest Territories,

on Tuesday, October 18th, A.D., 1983.

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THE COURT: Having found that Mr. Orvis was guilty of impaired driving, now receiving notice, which Mr. Orvis has recognized, requiring a sentence to be imposed of at least 14 days in jail on the offence, I will impose 14 days in jail to be served intermittently on the suggestion of Defence Counsel. I am doing so because counsel has pointed out that Mr. Orvis now has recently obtained employment, and serving the time otherwise might, or probably would interfere with his ability to retain his employment.

Therefore, I will direct that he serve the 14 days by presenting himself to the Yellowknife Correctional Center at 7 p.m., on Friday evenings, to commence on Friday the 21st of October, 1983 and each weekend thereafter, each Friday thereafter, and to remain in the center until 7 p.m., on Sunday evenings until this term is served.

Because this is his second conviction, I am also going to cancel the driving privileges of the accused for a period of nine months, as has been a custom of the Courts, and it has been directed as a proper consideration by the Appeal Courts in the Northwest Territories.

MR. ROGERS: The R.C.M.P. Have custody of his driver's license pending that he would appear in Court today as a condition for his release.

THE COURT: All right. Thank you, The arrangements will be made then for cancellation of his driving privileges, for the license to be submitted to the Court at some date by the R.C.M.P so it can be endorsed by the Court.



THE CLERK: Sir, could you just ask him if it's an N.W.T.

license?

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THE COURT: Is it a license for the Northwest Territories?

THE ACCUSED: Alberta.

THE COURT: Well, maybe we will just have to issue an order to the Registrar of Motor Vehicles that the driving privileges have been cancelled in the Northwest Territories as such.

Do you understand all that, Mr, Orvis?

THE ACCUSED: Yes, I do,

THE COURT: The clerk will be preparing the necessary probation order, It's now after five in the evening. A probation order is being required so that you understand that you have to report to the jail on Friday evenings in proper condition, not in an impaired condition, and so that you understand during that perio of time you must keep the peace and be of good behaviour. When would it be convenient, Madame Clerk, for Mr. Orvis to come back

THE CLERK; Any time tommorow, sir.

18 THE COURT: Mr. Orvis, when is the most convenient time for you to return to Court to sign the order?

THE ACCUSED: At 12:00 or after, From 12 to 1 is my lunch hour.

THE COURT: Would that be suitable, Madame Clerk?

22 THE CLERK: Yes, sir,

THE COURT: Thank you. The clerk will have the order ready,

and it will be on this same floor where you are to sign it.

there anything else?

THE CLERK: Yes, sir, Not with this case, We have one other case, Your Honour.

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MR. ROGERS: Your Honour, the R.C.M.P. presently have possession of the keys to Mr. Orvis' vehicle. As a condition of his release approximately a month ago, the keys were given to the R.C.M.P. so that Mr. Orvis would remain in the Northwest Territories, and as this matter has been dealt with before the Court, request that the Court order release of the vehicle's keys so that the vehicle may be moved to a permanent position for the next nine months, or whatever is to be done to the vehicle.

THE COURT: Is there any difficulty in transferring the information to the R.C.M.P., who has custody of the keys that they can be released immediately, and I will notify Mr. Orvis today that he himself is certainly not entitled to drive the motor vehicle, but it can arranged to be driven.

MR. SHARKEY: There's no problem.

THE COURT: All right, the Court will so order that the keys be returned to Mr. Orvis.
