





1 Well, this is such an unhappy duty that I have to  
2 fulfill today. The young man turned twenty-two years last week.

3 He first showed up in adult court in May of 1978, so  
4 that would have been somewhat over five years ago, for a theft  
5 offence. He was given a suspended sentence and probation.  
6 Within a week, he was before the Court again for breach of  
7 probation; spent two weeks in jail. Then in 1981, a theft charge,  
8 a break, enter and a breach of probation. He was given a  
9 suspended sentence on all three. January, 1982, two theft  
10 charges. He was fined. Back in court in May, 1982, with a  
11 mischief charge. Finally, he was sent to jail for three months.  
12 The same date, for a break and enter, 15 days. The same date, a  
13 prowl at night, 15 days; both consecutive. And September of  
14 1982, a breach of undertaking; 30 days in jail. Finally, in  
15 October of 1982, an attempt break and enter and two break and  
16 enters. He was given four months and four months consecutive  
17 and four months consecutive. In other words, a total of 12 months.

18 He likely was not long out of jail when he committed  
19 the offence in early August. While awaiting trial on that, he  
20 committed another offence. All to get liquor, and this type of  
21 thing is so prevalent in the north.

22 You say, Mr. Rogers, he would like to get alcohol  
23 counselling. We have a good alcohol program in Yellowknife  
24 connected with the Yellowknife Correction Centre. He apparently  
25 did not take advantage of it when he was doing his 12 months he  
26 was sentenced to in October of 1982, and, of course, it is not  
27 a matter of my recommendation or the Corrections people sending



1 a person to it. A person must have their own motivation and  
2 want to quit.

3 I am sorry, this is just -- it is very typical. The  
4 number of offences this man has committed in the last five years;  
5 he is a nuisance to his community. The 12 months he got in the  
6 Yellowknife Correction Centre, in the Territorial institution,  
7 did not register on him at all.

8 Would you stand up, please, Mr. Evaglok. I convict  
9 you on the charge of break and enter on the 8th of August.  
10 Direct you be imprisoned to a penitentiary for a period of one  
11 year. I convict you of the charge of break and enter on the 22nd  
12 of August and direct you be imprisoned for a period of one year  
13 in a penitentiary to be served consecutive.
