Well, if an accused has a right in law to demand and obtain a new trial as a result of a falling-out with his counsel at any stage in a trial, then that right would logically continue into the second trial and the third trial and the fourth trial. I can't see that, quite frankly, as being under one of the list of rights of an accused in considering full answer and defence and the rules of natural justice.

In my view, what we are really discussing here today is trial tactics and a disagreement between an accused and a counsel on trial tactics. As a result of that disagreement, counsel is discharged and new counsel are retained. Clearly, new counsel may work under some disadvantage, and I underline "may".

Courts of Appeal have no difficulty in coming to conclusions based on transcripts. I don't see that in this case in particular, and I am not trying to make a general rule, but in this case in particular that the accused's right to full answer and defence is particularly compromised. It may be made more difficult, it may have aspects added that were not present earlier as a result of his decision to change counsel, but, in my view, his right has not been compromised to make full answer and defence in any way.

I am unpersuaded to grant a mistrial or recommence the proceedings all over again. We are at a position
